KEY TERMS

- Adult: Age 25 or older, Young Adult: Age 18-24, Child: Under 18
- Don't Know/Prefers not to answer: Respondent is unsure or prefers not to answer a question. Move to the next question.
- First Respondent: The first person within a household that you are conducting the survey (i.e., participant, interviewee).
- Household: The people who live with you now or most of the time. This can be a parent + child, spouses or partners, group of youth living together, etc.
- Household ID: Household ID is a combination of letters used to link respondents together. The SAME household ID should be used for each member of the group.
- Sheltered: Individuals staying in emergency shelters (ES) and transitional housing (TH) on the night of the Point in Time count.
- Unsheltered: A primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings, including a car, park, abandoned building, bus or train station, airport, or camping ground.
- Chronically Homeless Person: A person who:
 - o Is homeless and lives in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency shelter; and
 - has been homeless and living or residing in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency shelter continuously for <u>at least 1 year</u> or on <u>at least four separate occasions in the last 3 years</u> where the combined length of time homeless in those occasions is at least 12 months; and
 - $\circ~$ Has a disability.
- Survivors of Domestic Violence: This population category of the PIT includes adults <u>who are currently experiencing homelessness</u> because they are fleeing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.
- **Doubled-Up:** Individuals who are temporarily staying in the home of friends/family.
 - **NOTE!!** Some CoCs include doubled-up households in the PIT data collection and some do not. Be sure to clarify with your local PIT Lead how your region is approaching this!

QUICK TIPS

- We highly recommend reading the survey questions in advance and rehearsing by asking and answering with a partner.
- If you are unsure what Continuum of Care (CoC) you are in, ask your agency or trainer.
- All the "Surveyor Questions" must be completed.
- Never put the address of a domestic violence provider in the "Specific Location".
- Write down the age of each member of the household, including the first respondent.
- All respondents within one household should be identified by the same Household ID .
- Correct Household ID composition → The CoC you are in First 3 letters of the First Respondent's First Name First 3 letters of the First Respondent's Last Name
 - O When Respondents refuse to have their names used for Household ID creations due to easy identification from having names with 3 letters or shorter → The CoC you are in First Respondent's First Initial First Respondent's Last Initial OR the CoC you are in-AAA-BBB
- A respondent does not have to answer any question they don't want to and can end the survey at any point. You should still turn in partially completed surveys.
- It is possible to conduct the survey directly through the PIT LIVE portal. However, if you interview households, you will need to track **the Household ID of the first respondent** (i.e., write it down) to link the household together. If you use a phone or tablet to survey, keep in mind that cold weather drains batteries quickly. Have a backup method handy (and a charger).

THINGS TO REMEMBER

- Be respectful of each respondent's time and privacy.
- Recognize that some survey questions could be intrusive and re-traumatizing. Avoid phrases like, "I understand".
- Ensure your own safety and stay warm.
