About The Training:

Explore the spectrum of decision-making support available to individuals who may need additional assistance in decision-making. Participants will gain a deeper understanding of supported decision-making (SDM) and guardianship. We'll examine how each approach can empower individuals while ensuring their rights and needs are respected.

- Individualized care for people under guardianship assures informed decision-making
- Combining restricted guardianship with supported-decision-making supports can lessen restriction of rights for some individuals, helping them retain as much autonomy as possible.
- Supported decision-making can help some individuals retain decision-making rights when appropriate supports are in place.
